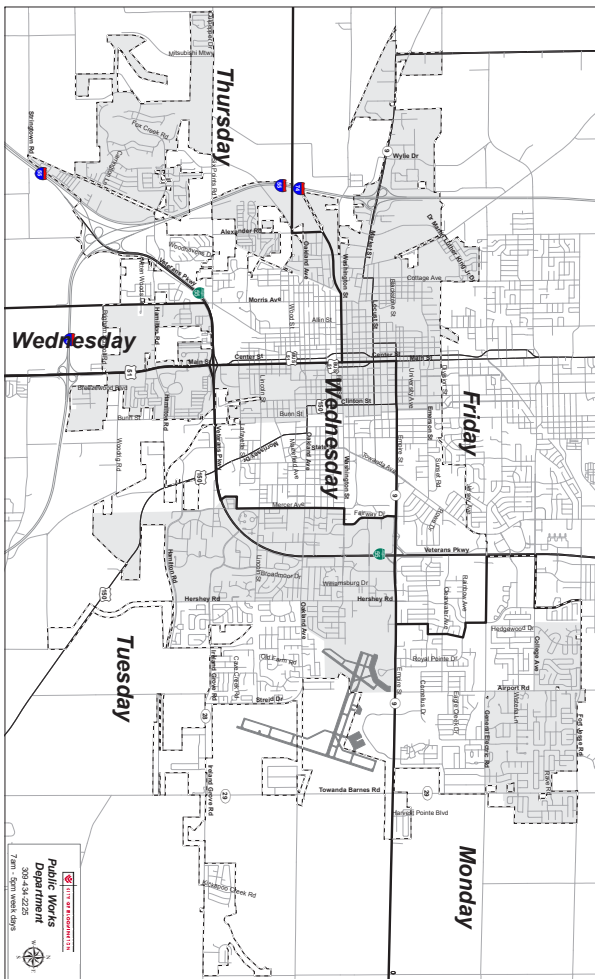


2011 Recycle Collection Map

- 1) Locate your residence on the map.
- 2) Determine which day of the week your garbage and recycle products are collected. Both are collected the same day of the week. However, garbage is collected every day and recycle collection is every other week.
- 3) Determine if your residence is located in a shaded or unshaded area.
- 4) If the area in which you are located is shaded, your recycle collection date on the calendar are shaded.

* Recycle and garbage will not be collected on Monday, December 26, 2011. Recycle and garbage normally collected that day will be collected on Tuesday, December 27, 2011, along with the regular Tuesday collection. Please contact the Public Works Department for details on this exception.

Single-Stream **RECYCLING** in Bloomington

No need to sort or separate! All recyclables can be put in one single bin.

Bin Requirements: Recycle bins are not provided by the City of Bloomington. Blue bins are available at local hardware stores; any type of bin may be used as long as it is labeled "Recyclables" or "Recycle".



The bin may not exceed 33 gallons in volume or 35 pounds in weight.

What IS **NOT RECYCLABLE?**

- **Motor oil containers**
- **Plastic drink cups**
- **#6 plastics (polystyrene)**
 - styrofoam
 - plastic egg cartons
- **Plastic bags**
 - grocery
 - bread
 - dry-cleaning
 - plastic wrap
- **Flexible vinyl squeeze tubes**
 - toothpaste
 - facial cleaners
- **Windows, mirrors**
- **Drinking glasses, dinnerware, ceramics**
- **Soiled towels, napkins, paper, foil**



What **IS RECYCLABLE?**

- **Plastics #1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 7**
 - containers for milk, water, soda, detergent, shampoo, salad dressings, margarine tubs, yogurt cups, frozen dessert cups, medicine bottles, etc. (lids included)
- **Plastic 6-pack and 12-pack ring carriers (must be cut up)**
- **Glass bottles and jars**
 - clear, brown, blue, or green (metal lids included)
- **Aluminum and Tin**
 - cans, clean disposable trays, pans and foil
- **Steel cans (including empty aerosol cans)**
- **Juice boxes, gable-top cartons, kitty litter containers**
- **Newspapers (including all advertising inserts)**
- **Paperboard**
 - cereal boxes, frozen food boxes, tissue boxes
- **Cardboard (cut down to newspaper size only)**
- **Computer paper, school paper, gift wrap**
- **Books**
 - soft-cover, and hard-back with the covers removed
- **Junk mail and envelopes**
- **Paper egg cartons**
- **Telephone books**
- **Magazines**

Did you know?

~35 aluminum cans = 1 lb of aluminum cans
Although the buy-back price of aluminum cans varies, on average 5 lbs could buy your Starbucks on the way to work.

If 2,750 households in your community recycle four aluminum cans a day, they can build a Habitat home for a family in need in just one year. That is equivalent to each person in a family of four recycling one can a day.
